27.8 MILLION AMERICANS DO NOT HAVE **HEALTH INSURANCE**

Representing 8.5% of the population



56% OF AMERICANS DON'T DON'T BELIEVE THEY HAVE ACCESS TO THE BEST HEALTHCARE IN THE WORLD

Only 23% believe they do have access to the best healthcare while 21% are undecided.



THERE ARE 2.6 DOCTORS FOR EVERY 1,000 PATIENTS IN THE UNITED STATES













AMERICANS SEE THEIR PHYSICIANS LESS FREQUENTLY THAN PATIENTS IN MOST OTHER COUNTRIES

On average, citizens in the U.S. go to the doctor just 4 times a year, compared to the 12.9 times per year Japanese patients see their doctors.







Zealand and Sweden have a lower average number of doctor appointments than the United States.

MANY **DOCTORS** NOW SPEND MORE TIME ON PAPERWORK THAN SEEING PATIENTS

A primary care physician who spends 5 minutes of face-to-face time with a patient will spend another 19.3 minutes, on average, working on that patient's electronic health records (EHRs).

HEALTHCARE AS A % OF GDP (GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT) IN THE US HAS INCREASED FROM 5% IN 1960 TO 18.2% IN 2018

Experts credit this increased percentage to the rising medical costs in the US rather than as an indication of changing governmental priorities.
